A: The simplest way to do this with GNU sed is to use the -n option which tells sed to not output anything to the stdout: sed -n -e '/selhalo/p' yourfile.txt or sed '/selhalo/p' yourfile.txt If you don't care about preserving the original contents of your file, you can just: cut -f2 yourfile.txt A: Did you try this? sed -n '/selhalo/{p}' yourfile.txt How Does My Dentist Spend his Money? by Jeanette Foster Dentists typically spend more than other medical professionals on office overhead. Our office is among those that spends the most money on overhead. I think we are the only office in the area that has monthly out of pocket charges for this. The reason for this is that with our current practice, it costs us money just to keep the doors open, because the low income families we serve couldn't afford the \$40 a month we charge our office to keep the lights on. If we didn't charge them, they wouldn't be able to pay our bills, so it is a mandatory charge that we impose on them, so that we can afford to keep the lights on! Today, there are several practices that I go to and have to pay charges that are not discretionary. A dental hygienist spends \$75 a month to provide hygiene for her patients. If this were to be done by a dentist, she would probably spend about \$50 a month. Today, one of our hygienists works as a part time assistant, cleaning the offices. When the office was full time, this would have been an additional \$1500 a year, in payroll alone. A dental assistant spends \$80 a month for materials, and \$60 a month for supplies, to provide the same services that one of our hygienists provides. This comes to \$180 a month, when all is said and done. The average dentist charges about \$800 a month for office overhead. We are in the mid-range of this, but some dentists spend considerably more. Dr. Araceli Madariaga, for example
